## Accreditation

Accreditation for seven (7) years is granted if the EPP meets all of the CAEP Standards and components, even if areas for improvement (AFIs) are identified in the final report of the Accreditation Council.

These EPPs have earned national accreditation in educator preparation for the first time:

## CAEP Accreditation with Stipulations granted for 2 years at the Initial-Licensure Level

Accreditation with stipulations is granted if an EPP receives one (1) stipulation on a component under any standard. Failure to submit a response to the stipulation within a two (2)-year time frames results in automatic revocation. Failure to correct the condition leading to the stipulation within the specified two (2)-year period results in revocation.

## Probationary CAEP Accreditation granted for two years

Probationary accreditation is granted for two (2) years when an EPP does not meet one (1) of the CAEP Standards. Failure to submit a response to the stipulation within a two (2)-year time frame results in automatic revocation. Failure to correct the condition leading to the stipulation within the specified two (2)-year period results in revocation.

## NCATE STANDARDS: CONTINUING (RENEWED) ACCREDITATION

The CAEP Accreditation Council is the accrediting body of CAEP. It determines the accreditation status of educator preparation providers (EPPs) and appoints volunteers to serve in roles related to the accreditation process.

At the spring 2019 meeting, on April 29, 2019, the following actions were taken for providers seeking accreditation through legacy NCATE Standards.

The recent meeting of CAEP's Accreditation Council culminates several years of preparation and examination of the EPPs seeking NCATE accreditation. Beginning with the institutional-reporting process and ending with the

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deliberation of the Council, much thought and effort goes into the accreditation process. EPPs were examined as required throughout each stage of the accreditation process to determine the degree to which each of the NCATE Standards were met. Meeting the NCATE Standards requires comprehensive self-evaluation and demonstration in each of the following areas: 1) candidate knowledge, skills, and professional dispositions; 2) assessment system and unit evaluation; 3) field experiences and clinical practice; 4) diversity; 5) faculty qualifications, performance, and development; and 6) unit governance and resources.

**Accreditation for the duration of an institution’s seven-year accreditation cycle is confirmed after a full or focused visit is conducted to remove previous problems or concerns.**

**Accreditation for two years with a focused visit** When one or more standard(s) is not met and concerns center on the unmet standard(s), the Commission will request a visit focused on that standard(s) within two years of the semester of the onsite visit.

**Accreditation for two years with a full visit** When one or more standard(s) is not met and problems exist across standards, the Commission will request a visit addressing all standards within two years of the semester of the onsite visit.
