Chicago State University (CSU), the oldest public university in the Chicago metropolitan area, invites nominations and applications for the position of Dean, College of Education.

CSU College of Education (College), which has held continuing national accreditation recognition by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) since 1954, offers a wide array of undergraduate and graduate teacher preparation programs, as well as an ALA accredited M.S. in Library and Information Science program, an M.S. in Technology and Performance Studies, and degrees in recreation and higher education. The College has 31 full time faculty including three department chairs and a current enrollment of 423 students, including 215 students at the master's and doctoral levels.

The Dean is the chief academic officer responsible for the implementation of all academic programs, including quality assessment, strategic planning, program review and accreditation, student and faculty recruitment, resource development, and allocation and representation within the University and to external entities. Reporting to the Provost/Vice President for Academic Affairs, the Dean will lead the development and implementation of a bold and exciting vision that will advance the College's mission in education, service, scholarship, and research. The Dean will work collaboratively with faculty colleagues, staff, and students to increase research activity, support community engagement, and develop new partnerships and initiatives.

Founded in 1867, CSU offers 34 undergraduate and 27 graduate degree programs to over 3,000 students through its Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, Health Sciences, and Pharmacy, and through its Division of Continuing Education and Non-Traditional Programs. CSU is one of fifty-eight institutions participating in Title III grants for Predominantly Black Institutions. Under the leadership of President Zaldwaynaka Scott, whose term began in July 2018, CSU has been committed to the processes of renewal and transformation.

Candidates must have a Ph.D. or Ed.D. from a regionally accredited university and be eligible for a faculty appointment at the rank of Professor. Requirements include at least five years of senior management experience gained within an academic setting; a record of distinguished teaching and research; demonstrated success as a strategic leader who cares deeply about education at all levels and has the dedication to lead a diverse college through the challenges facing all educational institutions. The successful candidate will exhibit a commitment to academic excellence and engaged community scholarship, along with a willingness to engage in fundraising efforts to support the College's goals.
